FROM THE PASTOR

SOLEMNITY OF CHRIST THE KING always falls on the last Sunday of the Church year. It reminds us that Jesus Christ is truly King over all creation. For now, our Lord reigns over those who love Him and willingly submit to His loving call. However, at the end of the world, He will come in glory to claim His sovereign authority over all creation. In the meantime, let us who serve Him always live in a manner which is holy and pleasing to the Lord who is our good and gracious King!

ADVENT BEGINS NEXT SUNDAY Advent begins next week. At that time, along with the whole Church, we will begin our annual preparations for Christmas, that day on which we celebrate the birth of our Lord and Savior, Jesus Christ. The Church calls Advent "a period of devout and expectant delight" and rightly so. That's because during Advent, we wait for and look forward to celebrating that Holy Night on which Jesus was born. So, as we begin our preparations, decorating, baking, shopping, and visiting friends and family, let us make sure we also prepare our hearts for the coming of Christ. Take some time this week to plan your Advent. Take some extra time for prayer. Get out your Advent wreath and, if necessary, get a new set of candles for it (prayers for the Advent wreath will be included in next week's bulletin). Plan to do some fasting as a way of preparation. Finally, make sure you use the Sacrament of Penance during the Advent Season. All of these are excellent ways to prepare for the coming of the Lord and for our celebration of His birth on Christmas. With the Church, let us use this coming time of Advent to prepare with devout and expectant delight.

SOLIDARITY IN SUFFERING Our bishops have asked that we join in prayer on this day for our brothers and sisters in Christ who are being persecuted for their faith in Iraq, Syria and other parts of the Middle East. Archbishop Lori of Baltimore has composed the following prayer for our use: "O God of all the nations, the One God who is and was and always will be, in your providence you willed that your Church be united to the suffering of your Son. Look with mercy on your servants who are persecuted for their faith in you. Grant them perseverance and courage to be worthy imitators of Christ. Bring your wisdom upon leaders of nations to work for peace among all peoples. May your Spirit open conversion for those who contradict your will, that we may live in harmony. Give us the grace to be united in truth and freedom, and to always seek your will in our lives. Through Christ our Lord. Amen. Our Lady, Queen of Peace, pray for us."
