THE EASTER CANDLE

During the Easter Season, the pascal candle which represents Jesus is kept in the sanctuary. On the Pascal Candle are a number of symbols. Five "nails" containing grains of incense represent the five wounds of Christ. Also, the Greek letters alpha and omega are inscribed into the candle. They remind us that Jesus is the beginning and end of all things. Finally, the current year is traced into the candle reminding us that we divide all time by Christ's birth.

DIVINE MERCY SUNDAY

The Second Sunday of Easter is also known as Divine Mercy Sunday. About one hundred years ago, Our Lord entrusted to Saint Faustina Kowalska certain revelations about His mercy. At that time, Jesus made this promise. He said, "I want to grant a complete pardon to the souls that will go to Confession and receive Holy Communion on the feast of My mercy. Whoever approaches the Fountain of Life on this day will be granted complete forgiveness of sins and punishment." I urge you to use the graces offered by our Lord on Divine Mercy Sunday and to partake in God's pardon and mercy. We will be having special prayers and devotions from 1:30 to 2:30pm. next Sunday at Saint Luke's. There will also be time for Confessions.
