FROM THE PASTOR

After the past few weeks of reflecting on the teachings of the Second Vatican Council, I thought it appropriate to spend a little time looking more specifically at a couple prayers of the Mass; particularly those of the Roman Canon (a.k.a. Eucharistic Prayer #1) which I almost exclusively use. In reading and reflecting on the most important prayer of the Mass, I got a bit of a spiritual kick in the pants, which seems entirely appropriate for the penitential season of Lent.

For some reason, something that I've heard multiple times over the past few years, and something that we were taught in seminary, hit me particularly hard. Throughout much of the Roman Canon, and all of the Eucharistic prayers for that matter, the prayers are addressed to God the Father and refer to Jesus using third person pronouns. "HE took the bread..." and then, at the words of institution, there is a shift.

The priest, at the time of consecration, then uses the words "This is my body" and "my blood." With those words, the priest stands more distinctly in persona Christi or in the person of Christ. The hard-hitting part with the shift to first person pronouns is a poignant reminder to the priest that he is to pour out his blood and offer the whole of his person for the people he is called to serve.

The words of institution remind the priest that his life is to be lived as a sacrifice to God for His people. The Mass is, and always has been, a participation in the Sacrifice of Christ – in these words, the priest not only offers the body, blood, soul, and divinity of Christ, but also offers his very self. Through Sacred Ordination, a man is conformed at the very core of his being to the person of Christ. Archbishop Fulton Sheen wrote a book, *The Priest Is Not His Own*, about the priest's call to a sacrificial life.

Throughout his book, which I consider to be a spiritual masterpiece, Archbishop Sheen challenges priests to live up to their calling and to live in accord with their sacred vocation. Nothing about the priest's life is to be about himself, but rather is to be lived in a manner that draws people to Christ. In a real sense, the life of the priest is to be a consistent 'death to the self' and an imitation of Christ crucified.

In part, this is what the traditional black clothing symbolizes. The priest is set apart from the world, symbolically dead to the world, and at Ordination promises to live a life of prayer and reverent celebration of the Mass and other Sacraments. In some way, shape, or form every part of the priest's life is to be in conformity with the self-less life of Christ. Without God's grace, it is impossible—and I would argue may be impossible without the support of God's holy people in the pews. I am beyond grateful to all of you for your prayers, as even the 'smallest' prayers are of infinite value.

Thankfully, none of us are alone in our walk with Jesus. The priest brings the Sacraments, and grace, into the world. The lay faithful receive God's grace and carry it out into the world. In reality, we're all called to holiness in accord with our station in life. And, in living the faith, we offer one another support. When we're dismissed from the Holy Sacrifice of the Mass, we hear words that find their roots in the Latin *Ite Missa Est*. Literally translated, it means Go, it has been sent referring to the Mass being 'sent' to God, and our being sent to bring God's grace to the world.

All of us, then, are tasked with accepting and God's grace and then to bring it into the world. It is my hope and prayer that, throughout the season of Lent, we are all more perfectly conformed to Christ and that we bring His grace into our little corner of the world.
